

Noah waited a few days. He found a dove from inside the boat and set it free. But the bird came back. There was still no dry land.


Noah waited a little longer. Then he sent out the dove again. This time it came back with an olive leaf in its beak. It had found dry land!

"Thank you, God, for keeping us safe!" said Noah.


"I will never destroy the earth with a flood again," said God. "This is a sign of my promise."

And then he died.


"This Jesus really was God's Son," said a Roman soldier who had watched Jesus die.
